Welcome to Billie Blake Fant - who made the move to Hamlet House from her home of 65 years in Houston, Texas. Life there revolved around collaborations with artists, and active participation in the Memorial Drive Presbyterian Church. Living on Lopez means more time with her daughter, Debbie. Still, it's a big change.

Her room is decorated with paintings, a four-poster bed, and colorful textiles, with two striking portraits of Billie, painted by a dear friend and artist. An IBM Selectric typewriter on her desk hints at her past work.

Billie enrolled in secretarial school after high school - her first job assisting the bank president of Frost Bank. While raising three kids, she worked many years for a large law firm, Vinson Elkins, using shorthand, typing and administrative skills on condemnations, such as to build freeways.

The opportunity to create an exhibit in the foyer of a large bank led to many rewarding years promoting local artists by curating art installations throughout the city. It didn't feel to Billie that she "was the first of anything, but simply doing something that needed to be done". She also developed decorations and permanent installations at her church. Her minister says in admiration, "There will never be another Billie." She looks forward to getting to know the island, and continuing to create art herself.

Residents actively participated in these shared, hands-on enjoyable experiences, with staff support. Such activities enrich the day, prompting memory sharing, engaging artistic interests, tapping different parts of the brain than reading or passive TV watching.

The Cottage residents also hold activities, often assisted by Board member Mary Ann Cameron and Cottage Executive Director Heather Harrison. These include events such as decorating the Christmas tree together for a holiday celebration at the Gathering Place, story-telling at Halloween and outdoor tea parties and farewell gatherings.

Community members also enhance activities at the Hamlet. Musicians and singers share music, bringing their guitars and beautiful voices for sing-alongs. 



The Hamlet has remained financially stable this past year, despite rising expenses. Inflation has affected the costs of supplies, food, utilities and staffing at the Hamlet House. Maintenance costs are rising as the 14 Cottages, Gathering Place and Hamlet House age and require attention. Occupancy at both of our facilities has remained high, but serving the needs of our lower income residents (seven Cottages, one Hamlet House bed) requires that the Hamlet rely on the generosity of donors to help cover the costs of care and maintenance.

In addition to the accounts shown below, we have a separate account to track long-term maintenance, a small endowment fund and several reserve accounts. Our unrestricted donations account tracks expenditures of general donations used for all of the Hamlet's needs. We are so grateful to our wonderfully generous donors. Thank you.
